SERVICE ACTIVITIES

Membership is open to sophomore, junior and senior boys who qualify scholastically and receive confirmation from the Principal based on citizenship and leadership qualities; organizes and supports projects such as the Glendale blood drive and holiday basket collection; develops and enhances student initiative, leadership and sense of citizenship; Dues are \$8.

Involved in a variety of community service volunteering throughout the school year; membership is open to freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors who have taken or plan to take classes within the Family and Consumer Science department; dues affiliate students on the regional, state and national level, as well as make students eligible to attend the regional meeting each October and participate in STAR events; meetings are held once a month where members discuss and sign up for volunteer events. A peer-helping program open to freshmen, sophomores and juniors; mediators are well trained in conflict resolution and are taught to handle a clearly defined, formal process; they act as facilitators between two peer disputants using specific skills like self-control, communication, problem-solving, active listening, critical thinking, and planning. Mediators are trained and selected each spring and work the following year.

Promotes a positive welcoming environment for all students at Glendale; efforts are focused upon new students to the Glendale community throughout the year by giving tours and being assigned as a mentor for new students as they assimilate into the GHS culture. S2S members must have 5 teacher recommendations completed to apply and are generally invited to join based upon faculty recommendations. It is the goal of this group to be approachable by all types of student groups.

Uses all aspects of theater productions to help the student improve public speaking, creativity and problem-solving skills; involves two different areas of theater: onstage (known as the cast, selected through an audition process), and offstage/backstage (known as the crew, chosen through an application process); presents two productions a year: a musical and a straight play. No requirements to participate in Theater.

ACADEMIC-RELATED ACTIVITIES

Provides students with the opportunity to engage in political debate; all students and all views are welcome. Having a full range of ideas and diverse opinions is encouraged and desired.

Juniors and seniors focus on tutoring other students in need of academic assistance in core classes. This is one of the requirements to earn A+ financial incentives for tuition and common student fees at any public MO community college or technical school after graduation. Students must have a 95% cumulative attendance and a GPA of 2.5 or above.

Involves students in new cultural experiences in a way that cannot be produced in the regular classroom setting; Encourages exchange students to become involved in school activities and supports the work of the foreign language department. VOCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Teaches the fundamental styles, concepts and skills of speeches and the art of debate; Introductory speech is open to all students. Advanced speech (Debate and Advanced Debate) is open to students who will be members of competitive speech and debate squad. By taking advanced speech, students are allowed to concentrate on two or three specific areas of his/her choice through participation in interscholastic speech and debate tournaments. Advanced speech students are required to participate in a minimum number of speech tournaments to help further his/her skills.

Students interested in majoring in Business in college and/or someday owning their own business will find their niche in FBLA.

Provides opportunities to learn about teaching and cultivates the qualities essential in a good teacher; develops the role of leadership and provides experiences related to teaching; facilitates awareness of the pros and cons of teaching; explores the courses necessary for a teaching degree; and discusses the current need of teachers in a variety of fields. Membership is open to anyone interested in a teaching career. (NOTE: Through the class, Cadet Teaching, members are able to gain first hand experience and receive high school credit hours by assisting grade school teachers.)

MUSIC-RELATED ACTIVITIES

Composed of selected singers who wish to further their vocal skills by performing more advanced music from classical to jazz; many performances require practices outside the regular class time.

An elective course which provides advanced training in large choral work and individual improvement of one's tone quality, blend and diction; teacher approval is required for the class; performs in a number of school events and activities outside the usual class time.

Works and performs with the marching band; promotes school spirit. Anyone is eligible to try out.

A fun, auditioned group that will travel around the state playing various styles of jazz ensemble literature. Unless the student plays guitar, he or she must be currently enrolled in a band or orchestra class. Auditions and rehearsals begin near the beginning of November and the season lasts throughout May. This group involves a participation fee or scholarship.

The most visible and active band ensemble at GHS; Comprised of approximately 100 students, the Falcon PRIDE Marching Band provides entertainment at all home football games, travels the area performing at competitions, participates in local parades, and ends the season with a performance at the Edward Jones Dome in St. Louis. Students must be enrolled in Symphonic Band or Concert Band to be eligible for participation. Rehearsals begin in July and the season lasts throughout October. This group involves a participation fee or scholarship.

An elective course offered for all students who play string instruments; gives students the opportunity to enjoy the classical side of instrumental music.

An indoor performance group where members learn a choreographed flag routine to perform at different competitions around the state; A demanding and exciting activity where members interpret music with dance and equipment routines. Anyone is eligible to tryout near the beginning of November. The season lasts through the end of April. This group involves a participation fee or scholarship.

An indoor performance group in which musicians learn a piece of music about 7 minutes long composed specifically for them; Music is performed to drill according to a theme; Travel & competition around the area and state are involved. This group is selected through audition usually comprising students enrolled in a band class; however, any percussionist within the school may audition. This group involves a participation fee or scholarship.
